Revalidation task & finish group - Summary report No. 3

From UKPHR 18c McLaren Building, 46, Priory Queensway, Birmingham B4 7LR

The third meeting of the task & finish group which is to help UKPHR devise a revalidation scheme took place in UKPHR's Birmingham office and by telephone conference call on Wednesday 27 January 2016.

The group had before it a paper prepared by David Kidney, which set out a proposed format and some initial content for UKPHR's revalidation scheme. The document was intended to stimulate and inform the group's discussion and in some places it offered group members alternative options.

The group indicated how they wished the document to be developed in order to form a draft revalidation policy which the group could consider at its next meeting (15th March). The group intends to finalise a proposal for UKPHR's revalidation policy and submit it to UKPHR for approval. Whilst it will be for UKPHR to decide on next steps, the group would expect widespread consultation on a draft policy and would wish to be involved in analysing responses and considering comments and suggestion made during the consultation period.

The group continues to consider the situation of independent registrants and in what ways a revalidation scheme needs to accommodate differences which arise because of their situation.

The group further considered what tools are already available to support professional revalidation – for example for multi-source feedback.

The timetable for the group's work remains that the group intends to be in a position to make recommendations to UKPHR by the middle of 2016. It is expected that UKPHR will consult on the revalidation scheme as proposed by the group.
